

Are You College Ready? Upcoming Assessments

PSAT – There are just a few more days to sign up for the PSAT. The PSAT is a practice test for the SAT and is only given once each school year. The test will be administered at school on Wednesday, October 17, during 1st and 2nd periods. Students who wish to take the test should bring \$14 and register in the Counseling Office with Mrs. Wright. There are fee waivers available for juniors who qualify. Results will come back in December and are an excellent resource when determining what to study to prepare for future college entrance exams. If you have questions, please see your counselor.

PLAN – All sophomores will be taking the PLAN on October 25, during the school day. The PLAN is a college readiness exam developed by ACT to help determine the skills and knowledge required to succeed in college, areas where extra help or additional courses are needed, and career areas that match the student's interests. Subtests will include English, math, reading, and science. ACT – The ACT is a college entrance test that will be administered to all juniors in March. The ACT is accepted at all colleges and universities throughout the United States and beyond as a measure of college readiness. Scores on this test will be reportable to colleges students apply to during their senior year* so students are strongly encouraged to start preparing now and to take the test very seriously. Working hard in rigorous academic courses in high school is the best way to prepare for this achievement test. College Entrance Exams: Which one is for me?

The differences between the ACT, SAT, and the Community College Placement Tests (Accuplacer, Compass, etc) can be very confusing. Because there's not ONE test that's right for everyone, the counselors at South Stokes meet with students individually and make recommendations regarding which test(s) are right for each child. As a general rule, students do not need to take a college entrance exam/placement test until their junior year at the earliest. Students planning to attend a four-year college after graduating from high school will likely need to take the ACT and/or the SAT beginning in the spring of their junior year. Those planning to go to the community college may only need to take a placement test. Mrs. Cheek is meeting with juniors now to help make plans for after high school. If you are not sure which test is right for you, she'll help you decide what's best for you. Regardless of which is best for you, preparation is the key to making your best score.
