## **Community College Placement Test**

Representatives from Forsyth Tech will be here on Thursday, March 28th to administer the community college placement test to seniors planning to attend Forsyth Tech, Surry Community College and Guilford Tech. We will also be holding prep sessions in March like we did in the fall for this test. Be listening and looking for information regarding a schedule for the prep sessions. If you are planning to attend a community college other than the 3 already mentioned and would like to know if they accept the same test FTCC administers, see Mrs. Sawyer.

Also, students who have completed their applications and placement testing by May 1 will be eligible to attend an early registration session for the Fall of 2013 here at South Stokes. More information about this fabulous opportunity will follow.

## **SAT Subject Tests**

Many colleges require students enrolling in their schools to take the SAT Subject Test for placement/registration purposes. Be sure you check the requirements of the schools you've been accepted to and are planning to attend to see if this is a step you'll have to complete. The SAT schedule for the remainder of the school year is below:

### **Males - Selective Service Registration**

All males are required to register with the selective service system within the 30 days prior to your 18th birthday. This is a civic and legal responsibility. Males who fail to register with selective service could be charged and <u>fined up to \$250,000,</u> <u>be imprisoned for up to 5 years, or both.</u> So lets just go ahead and register.....K?! DEADLINE	SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS
February 28th	<b>Buick Achievers Scholarship Program:</b> Students planning to major in Technology, Engineering, Design, or Business with an interest in the automotive industry are encouraged to apply for one of these 1,100 scholarships worth up to \$25,000 per year. Apply at <u>www.buickachievers.com</u>
March 1st	<b>Golden Leaf Foundation:</b> 215 scholarships are awarded each year to students demonstrating financial need and enroll in an NC public university or qualifying private college. Scholarships are valued at \$12,000 (\$3000 a year). Applications will become available in January, however students can visit <u>CFNC.org/goldenleaf</u> for more information.
March 1st	Scholarships for Children of NC War Veterans: If your Veteran parent was a resident of North Carolina when he or she entered military service, you may be eligible for a scholarship from the State of North Carolina to attend an approved university, community college or technical institute within the State of North Carolina. Funds provide scholastic support to help children of certain disabled, deceased, combat or POW/MIA veterans. For more information visit <u>http://www.doa.nc.gov/vets/locations/</u>
March 1st	<b>Rockingham Community College Scholarship:</b> high school seniors that have been accepted to RCC may be eligible. More information and applications are available in the Counseling office.
March 1st	<b>Legal Support Staff of Winston-Salem:</b> is offering a \$1000 nonrenewable scholarship to qualified students in Stokes, Forsyth, Davie, Davidson, Yadkin, and Surry counties. Applicants should be able to demonstrate financial need, and have at least a B average. Applications are available in the Counseling Office.
March 15th	<b>Stokes County Arts Council Scholarship:</b> available to Stokes County residents graduating from one of the county high schools planning to major in and pursue a career in an arts related field. For more information pertaining to eligibility and to pick up an application see Mrs. Sawyer.
March 15th	<b>NC Farm Bureau R. Flake Shaw Scholarship:</b> This scholarship offers 6 scholarships valued at \$3500 per year for 4-year to six seniors planning to study at a college or university in an agriculturally related curriculum. They also offer 2 scholarships valued at \$1000 per year for students planning to attend a community college and an agriculturally related field. Financial need, grades, understanding of the agriculture/agribusiness community, and leadership potential are considered. Applications are available in the
March 25th	<b>SECU People Helping People Scholarship:</b> one recipient per school valued at \$10,000 (\$1250 paid per semester) to attend one of the 16 colleges in the UNC system. Eligible seniors must have been accepted to one of the 16 UNC system schools, be a US citizen and resident of NC, exemplifies the philosophy of People Helping People through demonstrated leadership, excellence of character, integrity, and community involvement. March 25th	<b>Shelton Scholarship:</b> Students in Stokes County planning to attend either Forsyth Tech or Surry Community Colleges are encouraged to apply for this local scholarship. Applications are available in the Counseling Office.
March 31st	<b>Janice M. Scott Memorial Scholarship:</b> 3-5 scholarships for a one time award of \$2500 available for high school seniors who have a 3.0 GPA or higher, will be enrolling full time in an accredited college or university within the 50 states or DC, have demonstrated leadership abilities, and who demonstrate financial need by parents' income not exceeding \$100,000 a year. Applications are available in guidance.
March 31st	<b>Whitlow-Osborne Scholarship:</b> Students planning to enter an emergency services curriculum at a community college, technical institute, or trade school are encouraged to apply for this local scholarship valued at \$2000 (\$500 paid each semester). Awards based on scholastic achievement, intellectual ability, financial need, character, and promise of future contribution to society. Applications available in the Counseling Office.
April 1st	<b>Chester Arzell &amp; Helen Miller Montgomery Scholarship:</b> This \$1000 renewable scholarship is for gradua-
