- Review Graduation Requirements, transcripts, and Senior Contracts that you will receive in the first few weeks of school.
- ♦ Clarify short-term and long-term goals: Am I going to a 4 year college, a community college, or going straight to work? What are some college majors and/or occupations that interest me? What do I need to do to achieve these goals?

STUDENTS GOING STRAIGHT TO THE WORKFORCE

- ◆ Investigate careers online or in the Resource Room (www.cfnc.org)
- ♦ Consider taking the ASVAB this year
- ◆ Consider part-time work and/or internships to gain work experience
- ◆ Learn about developing resumes, preparing job applications, and tips for successful job interviews

STUDENTS GOING TO COMMUNITY COLLEGE/TECH SCHOOLS

- ◆ Investigate colleges and careers online or in the Resource Room (www.cfnc.org; www.collegeboard.com)
- ♦ Determine how to pay for college
- Complete the FAFSA in January to qualify for state and federal financial aid
- ♦ Consider taking the ASVAB this year
- Check admission requirements for the degree programs you are considering and take the necessary steps to complete admission (applications, information sessions/orientations, etc)
- ♦ Visit colleges and ask questions about admissions and programs
- ◆ Prepare for the College Placement Test that will be offered throughout the school year. The first test will be offered in the fall.
- Consider pre-college summer program and/or summer job or volunteer experience.

STUDENTS GOING TO FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES

- ♦ Take realistic, challenging courses that will prepare you for the rigors of colleges as recommended by your teachers and counselor
- ◆ Keep studying—colleges want to see that you're serious about your educations and are willing to challenge yourself throughout high school
- ♦ Investigate colleges and careers online or in the Resource Room finalizing your choices of where to apply—most early decision and early action applications are due by October 1 and November 1
- ◆ Do any last college visits early in the fall semester—check websites for open houses
- ◆ Register for the SAT and/or ACT this FALL and have scores sent to the schools you are applying to
- ♦ Determine how to pay for college (researching scholarships online, reading this Counselor newsletter to learn about local scholarships, checking financial aid websites at the colleges you are applying to, etc)
- ◆ Consider taking the ASVAB this year
- Check admission requirements for the schools you are considering applying to and plan to apply to 3-8 schools this fall (REMEMBER: Reach, Realistic, and Safety schools)
- Remember to request transcripts and recommendations several weeks before application deadlines
- ♦ Complete the FAFSA in January. Some school also require the CSS/PROFILE, a supplemental financial aid form, so make sure you check to see if your schools require this additional information
